Mopope Murals at the Post Office

The U.S. Post Office, located at 120 S. First Street is the home of murals by the renowned artists called the Kiowa Five!

The 16 murals were commissioned in 1936 as a WPA project for Oklahoma inside the lobby of the Post Office. Stephen Mopope assisted by James Auchiah and Spencer Asah created the murals that depict the ceremonial and social life of the Kiowa people.



ANADARKO, OK

National Hall of Fame of Famous American Indians!

Established in 1952 the Hall of Fame is home to over 40 bronze portraits of Native American leaders, artists, scholars and citizens. While walking around the outdoor garden you will be able read the history of each inductee. Benches are available along the walk to rest or sit and enjoy the beautiful fountain.



Anadarko Heritage Museum

This is a wonderful small town museum featuring historic information on Native American, European and African descendants who settled Caddo County.

Located in the old Rock Island Railroad Depot, visitors can see the historic past and early day antiques donated by pioneer families and the Native American community. It includes railroad memorabilia, Native American artifacts, military uniforms, guns and items from the time of settlement and development of Southwest Oklahoma.





Southern Plains Indian Museum

The Southern Plains Indian Museum displays the richly varied arts of Western Oklahoma tribal people including the Kiowa, Comanche, Apache, Southern Cheyenne, Southern Arapaho, Wichita, Caddo, Delaware and Fort Sill Apache. Their historic and beautiful decorated clothing, shields, weapons, baby carriers and toys highlight the exhibits. The museum also houses four Allan Houser dioramas. Two other galleries feature contemporary Native arts and crafts.

Wichita Tribal History Center

From the beginnings of the village farming societies 12 centuries ago to present day, the Wichita Tribal Center showcases the history and culture of the Wichita people. Through a series of graphic panels, traditional museum exhibits, the replica grass house and summer arbor, the life of the Wichita people is revealed. The center also contains a language archive and research library.



Historic Randlett Park

Randlett Park is located on the northwest edge of town and is composed of 38.6 acres. It is named after Col. James Randlett who helped developed the park between 1901-1905 just before statehood. The Park was designated a historic district with seven structures nominated on the Oklahoma Landmark Inventory. They include the National Guard Armory, the hydroelectric plant and dam, the above-ground municipal pool built in 1926, the automobile brick archway, croquet court sign, and the C.R.I. & P railroad bridge piers.

The Park includes playgrounds, an RV park, basketball courts, volleyball court, baseball complex, exercise equipment, walking trails, splash pad and, of course, the home of the peacocks!

Anadarko is also known for its many murals.
